One day, she passed on and was reborn in Tavatimsa. Malabhari asked her where she had gone the whole morning, and she explained her human existence to him. In the human world, the monks were taken aback by her sudden passing. The Buddha reminded the monks of the fleeting nature of life and added that desire for sensual pleasures could only lead to more rebirths.

On the way to pay homage to Buddha, a group consisting of 7 monks stopped at a village and were directed by the villagers to spend the night in a cave. In the middle of the night, a huge boulder slipped off from the top and blocked the cave's exit. It took the villagers 7 days to move the massive boulder. As to their fate, the Buddha spoke of an event in one of the monks' existence. Once, 7 cowherds saw an iguana going into its mound. Out of mischief, they closed all the exits of the mound to prevent the iguana from escaping and forgot about it for 7 days before they realised it and freed the iguana. On account of their deeds, they had been trapped without food for 7 days.



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FEBRUARY 2023

MAHAKASSAPA THERA VATTHU

One day, monk Mahakassapa awoke from a deep meditation and expressed his desire to allow the poor to offer him alms. However, Sakka, the king of gods, wanting to reap the merits of offering alms to the great monk, disguised himself as a poor old weaver and placed himself in the path of the monk. Upon receiving Sakka's offering, Mahakassapa knew that the sumptuous food could not be from a poor person. Perceiving the weaver was Sakka, Mahakassapa admonished him for not giving opportunity to the poor. Hearing this, the Buddha said "The scent of virtue far surpasses any scent obtained from any source of perfumes". Sakka was attracted by the great virtues of the monk MahaKassapa.

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KASSAKA VATTHU

While working on his land, a farmer heard the Buddha say to Ananda, his assistant, "See Ananda, a poisonous snake," to which Ananda replied, "I see, Venerable, a deadly, poisonous snake." The farmer was concerned and rushed to the spot, only to find a purse on the ground. Not knowing how to deal with it, he covered it with some soil and resumed his work. Later, the stolen purse, which was dropped by a thief, was found. The farmer was accused of the theft and he was led away and beaten. He kept repeating the conversations between Buddha and Ananda. The farmer's peculiar behaviour caught the attention of the king, who knew that those were the words of the Buddha. The Buddha was consulted, and the farmer's innocence was ascertained. Relating to this, the Buddha said one must be mindful to avoid actions which would later lead to trouble.

On their way to pay homage to the Buddha, a group of bhikkhus stopped by a village. Some villagers were preparing food to be offered to the monks when a stove caught fire. The stove fire shot up into the air, killing a crow that happened to fly over. Seeing the event, the bhikkhus decided to ask the Buddha about the crow's fate. Buddha told the story of a farmer who set fire to his ox out of anger because the ox was very lazy and stubborn. On account of this, the farmer had been burnt to death in the last 7 existences.

KUNDALAKESI VATTHU

Kundalakesi killed her husband out of self-defence when her husband tried to murder her to get hold of her wealth. Disillusioned with life, Kundalakesi left home and lived as an ascetic. Being intelligent, she soon became proficient in many verses of a certain faith. Her teacher told her to go forth and challenge anyone who could answer her questions, adding that she should become a pupil of anyone who could answer all her questions. Kundalakesi became known for her prowess as she was undefeatable. One day, she met Ven. Sariputta, who was able to answer all her questions. Ven. Sariputta asked if he could ask her a question, to which she accepted. Failing to answer the question and learning that it was from the Buddha, she asked to join the order of nuns and soon gained enlightenment. To this, the Buddha said, "Though one may conquer a thousand men in battle, he who can conquer his own ignorance is the noblest victor."

The wife of a gem polisher offered food daily to Ven. Tissa, an arahat. Once, a messenger from the King arrived with a ruby, which the gem polisher left on a table before he left to wash his hands. The house pet crane swallowed the gem as it took it for a piece of meat. After ascertaining that no family member had taken it, he confronted the monk about the missing ruby. Not getting an answer, he beat the monk till he bled, despite the wife's pleading. The crane was attracted to the blood. In a rage, the gem polisher kicked the bird as it came near, killing it instantly. Seeing the crane dead, Ven. Tissa revealed that the bird had swallowed the ruby. After the ruby was found, the gem polisher was remorseful, although Ven. Tissa did not harbour anger against him. When asked about the fate of the characters involved, the Buddha said, "The crane was reborn as the son, the gem polisher was reborn in hell, the wife was reborn as a Deva, and Ven. Tissa attained Nibbana."

A father was told by a respected hermit that his young son would only live for another 7 days and that he (the hermit) could not prevent this. On the last day, the boy paid homage to the Buddha and was saved from the tragedy. When the monks queried as to how the child had been able to live a long life, the Buddha explained, "By respecting and honouring the elders and those who are wise and virtuous, one would gain not only longevity but also beauty, happiness, and strength."

Koka, the hunter, went hunting with his dogs and passed a monk on his way. That day, Koka failed to bag any games. While returning with a bad mood, he saw the same monk again. He thought that the monk had jinxed his hunt, so he set the dogs on him. The innocent monk climbed up a tree, but Koka pierced his sole with an arrow. As the monk was in pain, he could not hold on to his robes, which fell on Koka, covering him. Seeing the yellow robes, the dogs mauled the figure, not realising it was Koka, killing him. The monk felt sorry for Koka and wondered if he was responsible for his death. The Buddha consoled him, "Whoever harms a harmless person, one pure and blameless, the harm will come back to him, like fine dust thrown into the wind."

The truth dawned upon her that death is universal. She returned to the Buddha and became a nun. One day, seeing the candle light flickering, she began to contemplate the fleeting nature of life. The Buddha appeared before her and encouraged her to continue to meditate on the impermanent nature of life. Kisagotami subsequently attained liberation.
